It stands apart from other certifications because it requires a combination of agile training, experience working on agile projects and an examination on agile practices, tools and techniques. ## PMI Agile Certified Practitioner (PMI-ACP)

### Educational Level

*Secondary degree (high school or equivalent) or higher.*

### General Project Experience

*2,000 hours working on project teams. These hours must have been earned within the last five years. Note: for those holding a PMP® or PgMP® credential, PMI has already verified that the candidate has exceeded these requirements.*

### Agile Project Experience

*1,500 hours working on agile project teams. These hours are in addition to the 2,000 hours in general project experience and must have been earned within the last three years.*

### Training in Agile Practices

*21 contact hours; hours must have been earned in agile practices.*

### Examination

*Tests knowledge of agile fundamentals and ability to apply to basic projects.*

### Maintenance

*30 PDUs every three years in agile project management topics.*

### Basic Fees

*PMI member US\$435, nonmember US\$495.*

## Eligibility Requirements

The eligibility requirements for candidates considering the PMI Agile Certified Practitioner (PMI-ACP) certification are:

- General Project Experience: Experience working on projects using any methodology
- Agile Project Experience: Experience working on agile projects
- Training in agile practices
- Passing a multiple-choice examination on agile principles, practices, tools and techniques
